


NCLEX Resources By: Kira Ryan



Clinicals

I COPED WITH NURSING SCHOOL STRESS AND ANXIETY BY... Giving myself time every week to not do anything nursing school related. Go out and have a meal with a friend, go have a drink, go out dancing on a Friday night. All 3?

What advice would you give to nursing students that will be completing their first clinical rotation? The more hands on you are the more comfortable you'll get.

How did you prepare for NCLEX? Uworld. Three weeks off of work. Spent all three weeks answering all practice questions within the question bank. I created custom 75 question tests that were all on the same topic. Week 3 I started creating random 75 question tests. Anticipate you'll have 265 questions when you walk in.

What are your top three tips when it comes to getting your first job as an RN? Apply everywhere. If you already have a healthcare job, see if you can get an RN job there (even if it just for 1-2 years' experience). Look into all New Grad Programs months prior to graduation to see when due dates are, etc.

What unit or specialty do you work in? Do you plan on staying in this unit/specialty? Operating Room. I plan to stay in this specialty. It takes a while to get a routine and you are constantly learning, but it's a great place to be.

Have you had any challenges when it comes to delegation and how did you overcome these challenges? Start by delegating tasks like vitals, the rest will come. Establish a good work relationship with people and help them help you.

In your opinion, how far in advance should nursing students start looking for a job? If you already work at a hospital, talk to your manager and let them know you're finishing nursing school and interested in staying at the same department. If you're new, start looking into new grad programs 'start date' months prior to graduation and look to see when their application deadline is.

Did you do a residency program? If so, what are some things to look for when applying to these programs? I did a residency program. I got into the same hospital I was already working at. You can learn if a hospital has residency programs by going to their websites.

Have you worked in a COVID-19 Unit? If so, what advise do you have for new grads working in these units for the first time? I have helped in several COVID units during the winter/holiday surge Dec. 2020 - Jan. 2021. Be sure you have all your supplies for all needed tasks, that way you don't have to continually don and doff PPE. If you don't know, ask.
